

ROME PERGOLA

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PENTHOUSE

The apartment is located at the last floor of a 1930s building, built on the cupola of the Saint Hermes early Christian basilica.

It was renovated in the '50s by the previous owners and then in 2008, keeping the original italian parquet floors, the wooden windows and doors, the marbles and the high plaster ceilings.

In the main sitting room the ancient chimney in Giallo antico (antique yellow) marble.

Two livable square terraces complete the plan of the flat; the one directly connected to the dining room still keeps the original ceramic floor.

The architect in the last renovation was very respectful of the main character of this old apartment, characterized by long and wide corridors and hall entrance, combining tradition and modern facilities.

Most of the furniture come from the architect's design, and of traditional 50's furniture already present in the apartment, and a contemporary art collection complete the eclectic re-interpretation of this typical italian style living.
